our singing is going to be some of our biggest challenges," says Mr. Carden.

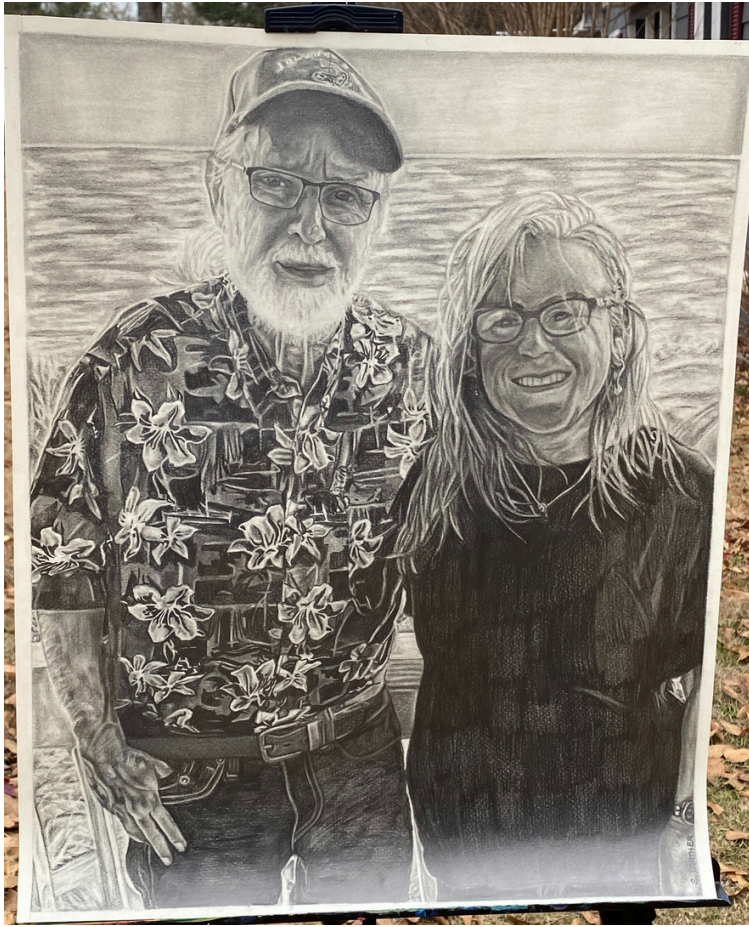

Prather is driven to continue to draw because she loves to see the finished product.

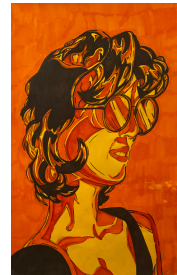
"Even though it is a tough process, I love seeing the finished product and how good it turns out," she explains. Just like many students, she finds that working in her room

Prather's favorite style of drawing is portraits. One of her favorite portraits that she has done is one of her grandpa that she made for her mother (pictured left).

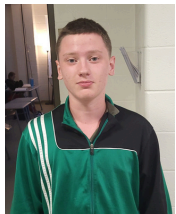
Prather says "I love to draw portraits because I love to draw people that I care about, and I love to give people a great gift."
